Leave-taking

We now enter our final two months as pastor and people. My last Sunday in worship will be June 18, as I will be travelling with our youth group on a mission trip during my last week before retirement. The time is rapidly approaching when we will say “good-bye” to the pastoral relationship we have shared for the past five years.

In life, times of transitions can be complicated, emotional, stressful, and sometimes confusing. There are better and worse ways of “leave-taking,” or saying good-bye. Sometimes the break is too abrupt and we have no time to share our feelings (the note and wedding ring left on top of the TV set). Sometimes the new reality is not clearly enough defined (the retired employee who still shows up at the office every day). One of my personal goals during this time of transition is to do a good job of leave-taking. Toward that end, two things strike me as most important: sharing appreciation for the past and providing clarity for the future.

In August 2012, I began my work as your pastor. Since that time, this church has changed and developed and so have I. It is difficult for me to express just how grateful I am to you for the time we have shared together. These have, in so many ways, been the best five years of my ministry—a great capstone! You have given me the gift of patience—putting up with my mistakes, my foibles, and my weaknesses. You have given me the gift of challenge—helping me to face tough situations and make hard choices. You have given me the gift of respect—taking my words to heart and honoring my leadership. For all these gifts, I am profoundly grateful.

Starting on July 1, I will no longer be your pastor. It does not diminish my appreciation for our shared ministry for me to be absolutely clear that it will conclude. My affection and care for you will continue—but in a much different way. I will pray for you. I will think about you and smile about good memories. But I will not be your *pastor*. Even though our family will continue to live in Dover, I will not return to provide pastoral services for baptisms, weddings or funerals. I

will not consult with church members about the future direction of the church. I will not make pastoral visitations or intervene in crisis situations. I will be attending worship with Sue and John at St. John's United Methodist Church, but I will continue my affiliation with the United Church of Christ by transferring my UCC membership to a congregation in the Rockingham Association of the UCC. In that way I will have access to UCC collegiality without interfering with the collegiality your future pastors will find here in the Carroll-Strafford Association.

This sort of clear separation may seem severe at first. But it is absolutely necessary for the long-term institutional integrity of the church. A host of United Church of Christ guidelines wisely encourage this understanding. My successors will need space and freedom to develop new ministries without comparison to, or comment from, Mike Bennett. This congregation's lay leadership and staff will need to develop new loyalties and new habits of communication and collaboration. In none of these tasks can I be constructively helpful after my departure. And, accordingly, I will establish and maintain a clear boundary.

But my deep appreciation will remain intact. The time we have shared will be complete as a highly-valued memory. The Greek word for "complete" is telos, which also means "end." Our time together will soon be completed. In the meantime, I welcome opportunities to talk with you about the time we have shared together or about our diverging journeys as we move forward into the future. You will be in my prayers and I hope that you will keep me in yours.

United by the "tie that binds," may we all serve Christ in new ways!

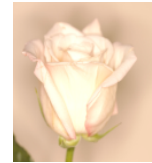
