Dear friends at FPC,

It has been a privilege to work closely with staff and several major boards in these opening months. Each of them brings such dedication and flexibility of spirit to their work. I am inspired by them and honored to be working side by side in this important year!

Many of you have contributed to the "Moving Forward" discussions in the parlor. These were held after worship throughout October. In those meetings we talked about how you are experiencing God's Spirit at FPC.

Now we are entering a period of listening to these thoughts with a warm heart and an open spirit. I have gathered a team of eight members, younger and older, with the support and advice of the Council and Board of Deacons.
