

Our Church is very honored to host nationally known composer, conductor and keyboard artist Mark Hayes at the New England Choral and Keyboard Festival concert in our sanctuary on Sunday, October 26 at 6:00 p.m. This concert event is sponsored by the Mark Thallander Foundation. There is no admission charge; a free-will offering will be taken at the concert.

The concert will feature a Festival Choir of over 120 voices, to be conducted by Mark Hayes, comprised of singers from our choir, area church choirs, and local choral groups from NH and southern Maine. 
