Holding on to Hope

Last week, I had the opportunity to attend a preaching conference with some of the best preachers in the country. The theme this year was "After the Storm – responding to trauma". Now most of us agreed that we were not really "after the storm", but reflecting together on the collective trauma of these days and the wisdom of our faith was meaningful in many ways.

Kimberly Wagner helped us to understand more fully the nature of trauma — which she explained was the ongoing impact and response to an event. Her working definition of trauma: "A blow or wounding of mind, body and spirit self that occurs when a destructive experience or event exceeds a person's or community's resources to process or assimilate the experience into preconceived frameworks of understanding." She pointed out that the word "trauma" has been pulled into our culture as a catch-all for all sorts of things which can make it a bit challenging to pin down.


She discussed a number of impacts of trauma such as a crisis of time – where the event becomes an eternal present and interrupts and distorts our sense of past-present and future. She also spoke about how drama can lead us to struggle to make our stories understandable, helpful and meaningful. Trauma can fracture our ability to make sense of things leaving us with a pile of shards that impacts our sense of self, identity, body, community and faith. She spoke of the way that a traumatic event can first bring a community together but over time can turn into a separating force that breaks communities apart along fracture lines.

I am still processing everything I heard and learned at the conference. While thinking about our lives through the lens of trauma is not a novel idea, it did help me to see some of the dynamics in myself, in our church, and in our country in some different ways.

As we try to make sense of yet another horrific event this week – piled onto so many others, it is normal and understandable to find ourselves numb, overwhelmed, despairing, and struggling. It is an act of faith to cry out to God, to acknowledge the pain of these days, and to turn to one another for support.

As people of faith, we live at the intersection of the pain of the events of these days with the hope of our faith. We hold on to our story of life being stronger than the forces of death, of God's love being stronger than our brokenness, of redemption and resurrection. These beliefs do not deny or lessen the pain of these days, but they ground us and orient us when the news of the day would leave us floundering. They bring us together when the events of the day would fracture us. Our faith reminds us whose we are. It does not wipe away the trauma, but perhaps it allows us to hold onto hope and to nurture resilience to move forward and to love our neighbors.

Budget Discussion--Sunday, June 12 following the service






available for those who need them when they enter the building. If we move to Red Community status, everyone will be masked in the building and Fellowship time will move outside.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors Update

"For....I was a stranger and you welcomed me..." Matthew 25:35

In late 2019, your Neighbors Helping Neighbors team set out to help a Nigerian family become self-sufficient. They were seeking asylum under United States law and international treaties. While they awaited action by the U.S. Immigration Court, we



provided a gift and loan to help them buy a car large enough to take the whole family to appointments and shopping (they paid the loan off ahead of schedule!); a generous member of our Church gave them an electronic keyboard; another member gives the oldest child piano lessons; and someone donated a printer/scanner/copier.

Mom and dad are raising their three children in the Madbury United Church of Christ. Please **click on this link** to view a video of the children singing "I Will Make You Fishers of Men."

The good news is that the Court granted their Petition for Asylum and the family is now eligible to pursue Permanent Residency (a Green Card) and, after five years of Permanent Residency, United States citizenship.

We should all be proud of our efforts to support these asylum seekers. We have lived our faith and made a difference in the lives of this young family. Thank you to all who contributed!

Mom and dad both work; they arrange their work shifts so one of them is always home with the kids. They have saved their earnings and look forward to buying a house with enough room for their two sons and one daughter. This event is presented in partnership with the <u>Black Heritage Trail of New Hampshire</u>.

The name "Juneteenth" is a blend of two words: "June" and "nineteenth." It's believed to be the oldest African-American holiday, with annual celebrations on June 19th in different parts of the country dating back to 1866. The holiday was first celebrated in Texas, where on that date in 1865, in the aftermath of the Civil War, slaves were declared free under the terms of the 1862 Emancipation Proclamation.


help us as well, so, to help raise the rest of money for the project, we are participating in the NH GIVES fund raising days on June 7th and June 8th.
