The In Between Time “The State of the Church”

A new year and an Annual Meeting are always an opportunity to take stock of where we've been and where we need to go. Rev. Jessica and I thought we would take some time to review what has been accomplished in our relatively short time here. Since I arrived 17 months ago and Rev. Jessica 14 months ago these are some of the wonderful things we have accomplished together as pastors and people:

- Provided inspiring worship services that remind us of God's faithfulness during wilderness times.
- Have been educating the congregation concerning the vital role of Stephen Ministers as ones who work closely with the ministers to provide follow-up care, while the pastors address critical pastoral concerns.
- Took a look at our history celebrating our rich heritage, enduring strengths and some unhelpful patterns that needed to be addressed.
- Meet weekly with the co-chairs of Christian Education/CE staff, working towards a vision while developing a process where we work collegially and purposely together.
- Held an after church workshop to discover our Core Values, which is the gun- powder of any group's mission.
- Put together a crack Stewardship Team with a wonderful narrative budget and ongoing stewardship education.

Worship Services: Sundays at 10AM & 5:30PM

- Held a Saturday morning mini-retreat to discern God's mission and vision for FPC.
- Conducted a church-wide survey and held cottage meetings in people's home to help us flesh out our mission further, to discover folks hopes for the future and what they wanted in a settled pastor.
- Vital youth ministry and Confirmation classes where youth, mentors and youth leaders alike are challenged through mission work, fellowship and reflection.
- A lively Sunday school program with attention given to the gathering worship time, teacher training and classroom visitation, regular meetings with teachers and board chairs, and curriculum review and coordination.
- A revitalized diaconate focusing on spiritual matters within FPC.
- Two leadership training events with more scheduled.
- A seminar entitled “How to Make it All Right When Everything Goes Wrong,” with Rev. Dr. Billy and Ms. Nancy Brown and plans to offer it to the whole congregation.
- Spiritual gifts training.
- Ongoing adult education opportunities with a Sunday morning Bible study for adult, Monday night book and discussion groups, and after church forums.
- A study of the City of Dover exploring needs and ways churches can help.
- A balanced Search Committee ready to go.

What lies ahead?

Work creatively to resolve our budget crisis by putting together a fundraising team and a growth and vitality team.

Finish the Mission and Vision statement that takes our many voices and presents one clear voice.

Explore the needs of our community and how we might minister.

Continue to develop leadership

Begin strategic planning and asset mapping

We also have reviewed with you the patterns and expectations of the interim time that most churches experience. While this process may seem time-consuming for those who are anxious for the settled leadership to arrive, even under the best of circumstances the search for a pastor in the United Church of Christ takes 18 to 24 months. Rev. Bendroth's average interim ministry has lasted 2½ to 3 years, which isn't unusual. Studies have shown that following a long-term pastorate can take even longer.

Why is this? One of the most important roles we perform as interim pastors is to help you as a church do a self-evaluation. The self-evaluation in turn assists your Search committee in developing a "Profile." Think of the Profile as a snapshot of your church, which captures your hopes and dreams that will need to be shared with perspective ministerial candidates. The interim time allows you to look at what you do best as a church, what you'd like to do better, what you might decide to discontinue, and even what you've dreamed of starting up. We call this mission. God has something unique for every church to do based upon their gifts, resources, and location. It is the engine that runs the train.

It's also a time to look at infrastructure. Models that worked well in one generation may not be as effective in another as society, families, and daily demands change. It's also a time to develop leadership: to help people discover their gifts and passions, to raise up and train new leaders, and allow others who are ready to step aside.

During the interim time unresolved conflicts often emerge as they have at First Parish. Again, this isn't unusual. This happens to other churches in transition too. Instead of ignoring them, we learn that conflict means people care about things deeply but need to discover new ways to talk about differences and find new ways to communicate more effectively.

Each pastor has his or her own style and strengths so the interim time provides opportunity to hear a different style of preaching, worship leadership, and pastoral care so that the congregation can adjust to different ways of ministry before calling a new pastor.

If the above work is not done and there is a rush to find a new settled pastor, the new person usually has a short tenure because unresolved issues continue to emerge. Churches are not corporations where when a CEO resigns the company hires a head hunter and gets someone within 6 months. Churches are complex emotional organizations that require an intentional process. This is why we are here to help you.

For those of you who think the process is taking too long, we respond by saying, we are right on schedule. We would be further along except that unexpected crises around staffing, budget and internal conflict slowed the process but needed to be dealt with. This too is part of the normal ebb and flow of ministry.

Many in leadership have said that First Parish has turned a corner. Attendance is up, anticipation is in the air, and we are doing hard but good work. For those of you who have decided to sit it out until a new pastor is called we ask why? As a coal that is placed on a hearth by itself goes out, so does a Christian who is not worshiping and meeting with fellow Christians regularly. We need everyone's participation to make this interim time as productive as possible. Withholding money or participation only weakens the presentation of the church to pastoral candidates.

First Parish Church is part of the Christian adventure. This congregation makes a difference in people's lives. Together we give witness to the Prince of Peace in a manifestly violent world; we practice hospitality in an inhospitable world; we study kindness in an unkind world; we exercise forgiveness in an unforgiving world; and we mediate the love of a God so big and wide that it blows your mind.

Come and be a part of it! Join us!

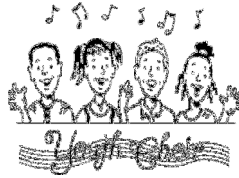
